EPNS Fellowship 2016

The EPNS has been thrilled to award 6 EPNS Fellowships this year. As promised, we will continue to share updates. This month here are summaries from 2 EPNS members who have recently been awarded an EPNS Fellowship about their goals:

Dr Silvana Kau from Albania going to Istitituo Di Ricovero E Cura A Carattere Scientifico, Italy. Awarded a Clinical Fellowship.

> My goal is to deepen my knowledge in epilepsy including semiology of seizures and antiepileptic drug election in order to be able to evaluate and manage paediatric patients with refractory epilepsy, establishing optimal medication regimens, maximizing seizure control and minimizing side effects. I intend to learn performing standard and video-EEG. I have particular interest in epileptic encephalopathies, especially since early and proper management, including vitamins, could have a positive effect in seizure control and in neurodevelopment, cognition and, overall, quality of life in the long term. Looking forward for this wonderful experience.

Dr Barbara Benova from Czech Republic going to Great Ormond Street Hospital, London, United Kingdom. Awarded a Research Fellowship.

> • My primary research interest lies in paediatric epilepsy surgery patients, most of who suffer from malformations of cortical development (MCD). MCD comprise multiple syndromes associated with abnormalities in the structure of brain cortex and subcortical structures, a significant proportion of which lead to development of pharmacoresistant epilepsy manifesting in the first months to years of life, often with deleterious effects on the child's development. A broad spectrum of genetic changes in various MCD syndromes has been identified so far, mostly by means of next generation sequencing (NGS). I would like to learn from the experience of Great Ormond Street Hospital to be able to extend my expertise in research of MCD. In the proposed research project, brain tissue samples obtained during respective epilepsy will undergo genetic analysis. By correlating clinical outcomes of epilepsy surgery patients with MCD with genetic abnormalities present in their tissue samples, we will be able to provide a more complex picture consisting of both clinical and genetic data that in the future may help us elucidate underlying mechanisms of MCD formation.
