EPNS Central Eurasia Workshop 2023



The main themes were structured neurodevelopmental assessments, and intervention in early infancy: evidence and integration into clinical practice.





EPNS Training Course: Riga, Latvia 2023

The EPNS has a 3-year rolling EPNS training programme with an aim to cover most main topics in the EPNS Training Guide over the cycle, promote contact between paediatric neurology trainees and for qualified paediatric neurologists to refresh their knowledge. 
EPNS Monthly Webinars

EPNS Membership, PR, and Website Report


I am delighted to report that in 2023 we continue to welcome new members to the Society daily.

I am delighted to report that the number of EPNS members over the last year has increased, and we now have a significant total of 2,547 EPNS members.

EPNS New Membership Categories

We have introduced three new membership categories for colleagues who are an indispensable part of modern child neurology practice. EPNS Representatives

The EPNS has appointed EPNS Representatives in key organisations and this year has been a busy time. I thank all EPNS representatives for their hard work and dedication.

Here are some highlights from 2023 so far:

OneNeurology



The EPNS is a partner of OneNeurology which is an initiative aiming to unite and strengthen neurology-related groups to stimulate collaborative advocacy, action and accountability for the prevention, treatment, and management of neurological disorders worldwide. OneNeurology was an

instrumental player in implementing and communicating the IGAP and is now focusing on implementation through the member states. We are delighted to announce that Coriene Catsman-Berrevoets was recently elected as vice Chair of OneNeurology for 2 years and will be a great asset in advocating for child neurology. The paper 'Global synergistic actions to improve brain health for human development' was recently published in Nature Neurology Review featuring EPNS members as co-authors.

International Presidents



The group meets virtually every 6 months with the aim to collaborate and avoid duplicating activities. One of the current initiatives focuses on working together to ensure steps are being taken to develop a Global Regional Initiative Programme (GRIP) which aims to upskill a region in the space of child neurology.



European Brain Council (EBC)



The EPNS has been a full member of the EBC since 2021. The EBC is non-profit network of key players in the "Brain Area" which consists of Scientific societies, patient organisations, professional societies, and industry partners. Sameer Zuberi is the EPNS legal representative.

The EBC is a powerful supporter for prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of brain diseases and research of the brain as a priority for Society. Through this network, the EPNS is advocating at an EU level for the life-course approach to brain health from antenatal influences on brain development, through to childhood, adolescence and onto later life.

The EPNS will continue to work closely with the EBC.

European Academy of Neurology (EAN)



The EAN is a Society focusing on Adult Neurology in Europe, working closely with the EPNS. The two societies have a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate in education & research. The EPNS is pleased to have representatives on

nineteen EAN scientific panels, which have a significance for child neurology. Recently the Presidents of the 2 societies met with other board representatives and the collaboration is developing stronger with an emphasis on especially working together in the field of brain health, guidelines and the process of transition.

European Reference Networks: ERNs



ERNs are virtual networks involving healthcare providers across Europe. They aim to facilitate discussion on complex or rare diseases and conditions that require highly specialised treatment, and concentrated knowledge and resources. The ERN initiative receives

support from several EU funding programmes. The EPNS has been working hard to nurture existing and develop new Memorandum of Understanding with ten ERNs.

European Academy of Childhood Disability (EACD)

We are delighted to further cement our relationship with the EPNS with the recently signed Memorandum of Understanding.

Committee of National Advisors: CNA

With one representative from almost all European national paediatric neurology associations, this committee report continues to be a valuable network in spreading the word about the activities of the EPNS and will be meeting during the EPNS Congress in Prague.

Scope

The EPNS Guidelines committee was created for promoting of highquality and homogenous patients care (diagnosis, treatment) based on existent evidence all over Europe. The Committee is formed of eminent professors, members of the EPNS Board and numerous invited specialists, non-board members (for specific tasks), and the YEPNS members of the Guidelines Group.

Prioritization

Following the distribution of the questionnaire created by the GC of the EPNS and YEPNS, Marietta Papadopoulou, the current YEPNS president identified the topics for which practice protocols and guidelines are necessary with priority.

EpiCARE – ILAE-EAN-EPNS guidelines

EPNS is currently a partner in the process of guidelines production initiated by EpiCARE in association with the 3 professional societies: Infantile spasms, Dravet Syndrome, Lennox-Gastaut Syndrome. EPNS will also participate in the Epilepsy surgery and Status epilepticus Guidelines. The Guidelines will be published in the EJPN.

Project on Transition in Europe

The working group on Transition In Europe currently finalized a comprehensive literature search on the situation of transition in pediatric neurological disorders from child to adult care. The results will be published in the EJPN. Current discussion with EAN aim for creating common practice protocols in transition in PN disorders.

Website

A subgroup of the GC discussed and decided the pathway of guidelines production and responsible persons for decision making. The information will be soon displayed on the EPNS website.

A little more information about

The European Paediatric Neurology Society (EPNS)

A society for physicians with a research or clinical interest in Paediatric Neurology. Honorary membership is for persons who the society wishes to honour for outstanding distinction in the field of paediatric neurology.

Associate membership is awarded, on application, to all paediatric neurologists and colleagues in related fields and that belong to their national society or association in their field and to any physician, basic scientist or clinical scientist trainees in paediatric neurology who shows an interest in the neurology of infancy, childhood, or adolescence, whether in research or in clinical medical care. There are no geographical restrictions to associate membership. Associate members pay an annual subscription, which includes subscription to the European Journal of Paediatric Neurology, the Journal of the Society. **Ordinary membership** is for any associate member that is also in practice in Europe (currently taken as the region for which European Office of WHO is responsible). Transition from associate to ordinary membership takes place by the vote of the general assembly at the meeting of The Society. The only difference between associate and ordinary membership is the entitlement of ordinary members to vote for and stand as candidates for election to the Board of the Society.

EPNS Membership Fees for 2023 (and 2024)

EPNS membership fees (also known as subscription fees) are payable each year and cover the period 1 January until 31 December.

Each fully paid up member of the EPNS receives access to the <u>EJPN</u> as part of their membership (printed and online ,or online only access, depending on the fee paid). The EPNS Membership Fee paid for the year 2023 depends on several factors:

1. Your EPNS Membership Category

For physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology, the EPNS Membership categories are based on the World Bank (WB) income category of the country in which you practice.

- WB4A= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in Class 4 high income nations on <u>CLICK HERE</u> NOT highlighted in blue
- WB4B= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in Class 4 high income nations on <u>CLICK HERE</u> HIGHLIGHTED in blue
- WB123= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in countries NOT in Class 4 high income nations, i.e., countries NOT on <u>CLICK HERE</u>
- GNP = Mutual members of the Gesellschaft für Neuropädiatrie (GNP) and the EPNS



The EPNS also has the following categories for colleagues who have an interest in paediatric neurology. These categories are not based on the World Bank classification, they are the same for all nations:

- Trainee/Resident= qualified physicians/medical doctors who are in training to in Paediatric Neurology or another field in medicine and have an interest in Paediatric Neurology
- AHPN = Allied Health professionals and Nurses with an interest in Paediatric Neurology, e.g., Specialist Nurse Practitioners, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language therapists, Psychologists/Neuropsychologists, Dieticians, Radiographers, etc.
- NSCS = Neuroscientists and other Clinical Specialists with an interest in Paediatric Neurology. This is a broad group ranging from bench scientists to specialized technically trained individuals encompassing: Neurogenetics, Neurochemistry, Neurophysiology, neurodevelopmental biology, Neuroepidemiology, health economists, data modelling (machine learning) specialists, etc.
- Student= Medical undergraduate students with an interest in Paediatric Neurology

2. Online only Journal access or printed Journal too

Each fully paid-up member of the EPNS automatically receives access to the <u>Society</u> <u>Journal</u> as part of their membership. EPNS members can opt to pay a Membership fee with online access to the Journal or they can pay more and also receive a printed copy of the Journal which will be posted to their nominated mailing address.

3. Pay for 2023 or pay for 2024 as well

EPNS members can opt to pay for 2023 only, or for convenience, pay the 2023 and 2024 EPNS membership fee at the same time for an approx. discount of 10% for the 'online only' option.
