EPNS Treasurer & Finance Report

I am pleased to report that the EPNS continues to successfully finance its ongoing activities.

Organised by the **EPNS Scientific and Research Committee** in conjunction with Intercongress and the Local Organising Committee, it was a pleasure in June 2023 to host our 15th EPNS Congress in Prague with more than 2,000 attendees. The event was subsidised in several different ways by the EPNS and was a great success for education, research, and networking opportunities for paediatric neurologists from around the world.

The **EPNS Education and Training Committee** has also had a busy year and of course, in the tradition of the EPNS, we continue to host and financially subsidise our 3-year rolling EPNS training programme. After 2 years of virtual courses, finally Riga in Latvia were able to host an inperson event in their country which proved to be a great success. In

addition, the EPNS supported the Central Eurasia workshop in Kazakstan, and received excellent feedback. A new area for this committee was the introduction of the EPNS Exam, which as a one-off special offer, was offered to candidates at a much-discounted registration fee. This year the EPNS invested funds into the roll-out of the EPNS Moodle which offers our EPNS members access to a whole plethora of learning resources. Funds continue to be invested in online ways for the EPNS to provide educational opportunities for our members, such as the virtual platforms for our Monthly Webinars, Online Training Courses, Journal Clubs, Case Discussions, etc. It is always a great pleasure to fund the EPNS Fellowships (8 in 2023) and EPNS Visiting Teachers (2 in 2023) where we enable career changing experiences to take place.

The still relatively new **EPNS Advocacy and Collaboration Committee** has made great progress and the EPNS has been able to fund several fruitful collaborations and visits to raise the voice of child neurology.

The **EPNS Guidelines Committee** has become more established, and funds have been used to develop guidelines in for example, paediatric epilepsy.

The **EPNS Finance, Membership, PR and Website Committee** and especially also our Administrative Team (Sue Hargreaves and Mel Knowles) play a central role in running our Society and are happy to announce that membership is growing at a steady pace over the past years. We continue to strive to keep our administrative costs to a minimum.

Altogether, I can report the EPNS has a healthy financial situation with adequate funds domiciled in a safe bank account at a Private Bank in Germany. Our system for detailed budgeting for our five main committees (see above) allows us to monitor all financial matters closely and to let the EPNS flourish for the benefits of its members and all their activities in the field of child neurology.

15th EPNS Congress 2023

The 15th EPNS Congress took place at the Prague Conference Centre, Prague, Czech Republic on 20-24 June 2023, hosted by Pavel Kršek. The theme was:' from genome and connectome to cure.' The programme was developed with innovative platform sessions and distinguished invited speakers. An EPNS record breaking 746 abstracts were submitted and with pleasure together the Czech national society, the EPNS Congress awarded 30 bursaries.

It was anticipated that the Prague EPNS Congress, the first fully inperson after the pandemic, was going to be a special event and having examined the evaluation report, it didn't disappoint! With more than

2,000 participants, the Congress surpassed all expectations. The Congress presented a scientifically stimulating programme with an outstanding Aicardi Award Lecture, three full days of educational sessions, networking, interaction, updates from our industry partners, and the EPNS Academy & Highlights in Paediatric Neurology as a grand finale.

The Pre-Congress Symposium took place on 20 June 2023 in Prague, focusing on "Drugresistant epilepsy in the 21st century: From molecular mechanisms to precision therapies". This too proved to be a successful event with 528 participants organised in collaboration with EpiREC, ERN-EpiCARE and the ILAE. Congratulations on this achievement.

I thank all speakers, my colleagues on the EPNS Board, Local Organising Committee (LOC) and the YEPNS for all their hard work in planning the event and developing a stimulating scientific programme. Special thanks must be expressed to Pavel Kršek and Kveta Janoušková for their dedication in organising such a wonderful event. 

EPNS Exam

The EPNS Exam assesses the basic knowledge needed to underpin Paediatric Neurology training. It is as an exam which will benefit Paediatric Neurology trainees/residents who are qualified physicians and have completed at least 2 years training and established registered Paediatric Neurologists who currently practice in the field of Paediatric Neurology and would like an assessment of their continuing knowledge.

Achieving a pass in the EPNS Exam is an excellent personal goal in this area of specialised medicine. Candidates who have passed the EPNS Exam have an additional qualification which may be an advantage when applying for a new role.

Candidates wanting to test their knowledge, including those in countries without a nationally recognised exit exam, will find it very helpful.



On 20 June 2023 the first summative EPNS Exam took place in Prague. There were 100 Multiple choice Kprim and A questions of a high standard. I thank all candidates for their participation, and I extend my congratulations to all those who successful passed the EPNS Exam and have been issued a certificate. All candidates were invited to complete a feedback survey and their comments have been invaluable for our future development of the EPNS Exam. Plans are already making good progress to prepare for the next EPNS Exam taking place on 8 July 2025.



To sit the EPNS Exam, you do not need to be an EPNS member but you must belong to one of the following 2 categories:

- Residents/trainees in Paediatric Neurology with at least 2 years of training, at the time of the EPNS Exam and who are already qualified physicians and. Note: Candidates and their tutor/trainer will need to sign a proforma of confirmation to complete registration.
- Registered as a specialist Paediatric Neurologist and currently working in a major commitment in the field of Paediatric Neurology. Note: Candidates will need to sign a proforma of confirmation to complete registration.

The EPNS Exam covers a broad range of Paediatric Neurology and is based on the <u>EPNS</u> <u>Learning Objectives</u> and <u>EPNS Training Guide</u>


Young EPNS (YEPNS)

5th EPNS Masterclass 2024



This EPNS biennial event will take place on 19-21 September 2024 at Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, UK (accommodation also in St Catz and Gonville and Caius) and the topic this time is 'Great Expectations

Expectations are growing all the time in our specialty: new diagnostic techniques and groundbreaking treatments appear incredible one day; but by the next have become the "new normal" that everyone expects of us. New possibilities bring new responsibilities: to make diagnoses as rapidly as possible to ensure best possible outcome; to offer every treatment possible, as close to home as possible. Who will pay for these new capabilities? Or give us the extra time we now need to deliver them? How can we carry on doing more and more? And there are still so many situations we can't help — catastrophic brain injury, many remaining neurogenetic disorders. Families' expectations have been raised by the good news stories: 'why can't my child have that treatment I read about online?" "I don't believe you when you say there's nothing that can be done". We may believe their expectations are unrealistic but how can we be sure? What are the limits of recovery in the brain? When should we strive? And when should we ask parents to accept that whilst care is very possible, cure isn't?

- Kevin Rostasy, Germany, will visit Astana Medical University in Kazakhstan Approach to a child with a suspected autoinflammatory disease in the context of the extensive differential diagnosis. Further, the spectrum of white matter diseases including NMOSD, MOGAD, MS and other rare entities will be discussed through a series of case presentations given by the participants and formal teaching.
- Dana Craiu, Romania, will visit Kyrgyzstan. Epilepsy disorders: the lectures will be interactive and based on case-examples; topics covered will be Epilepsy diagnosis; Epilepsy classification including 2022 syndromes classification. Treatment choice based on current guidelines, including epilepsy surgery and ketogenic diet. Treatment discontinuation and epilepsy in females will be other subjects. Case discussion and differential diagnosis will use EEG and video-EEG investigation methods, MRI and PET.

The Committee are delighted to report that in 2023 we continue to welcome new members to the Society.



The number of EPNS members over the last year has increased, and we now have a significant total of 2,441 EPNS members.





Ratifying new members

All new members are welcomed to the EPNS as an Associate Member. Ordinary membership is ratified by the Board and approved by a vote at the general meeting of members. The EPNS Board ratified qualifying members who have joined since the last meeting on 2 May 2022 and on 24 June 2023 were approved by the general assembly.

EPNS New Membership Categories

We have introduced three new membership categories for colleagues who are an indispensable part of modern child neurology practice. All members in these categories are eligible to pay the same discounted EPNS membership fee already offered to EPNS trainee paediatrians and trainee paediatric neurologists:

- **AHPN =** Allied Health professionals and Nurses with an interest in Paediatric Neurology, e.g., Specialist Nurse Practitioners, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language therapists, Psychologists/Neuropsychologists, Dieticians, Radiographers, etc.
- NSCS = Neuroscientists and other Clinical Specialists with an interest in Paediatric Neurology. This is a broad group ranging from bench scientists to specialized technically trained individuals encompassing: Neurogenetics, Neurochemistry, Neurophysiology, neurodevelopmental biology, Neuroepidemiology, health economists, data modelling (machine learning) specialists, etc.
- PhD Student = full time PhD Students
- Medical Student = undergraduate students interested in Paediatric Neurology

EPNS membership fees 2024



Our goal is to advocate at the highest level for the lifecourse approach to brain health from antenatal influences on brain development, through to childhood, adolescence and onto later life. Plus, we continue to develop fruitful collaborations with related societies. The committee continues to reflect on our collaborations to ensure they are beneficial to the EPNS goals.

Intersectoral Global Action Plan on epilepsy and other neurological disorders (IGAP)

Whilst this committee has many

States adopted the IGAP 2022-2031, which aims to improve access to treatment and care and quality of life of people with neurological disorders, their carers and families as well as promote brain health across the life-course. It includes actions to be undertaken by all stakeholders to attain the global targets.

The 5 strategic objectives of the global action plan by 2031 are:

- 1. Raise policy prioritisation and strengthen governance.
- 2. Provide effective, timely and responsive diagnosis, treatment, and care.
- 3. Implement strategies for promotion and prevention.
- 4. Foster research and innovation and strengthen information systems.
- 5. Strengthen the public health approach to epilepsy.

The EPNS has identified it is our duty to support, advocate and ensure the IGAP is implemented across Europe with specific reference to paediatric neurology and the EPNS Board are working to embed the objectives into all EPNS committees so that they become part of our day-to-day work. In the coming months, the EPNS will form an action plan.

EPNS Representatives

The EPNS has appointed EPNS Representatives in key organisations and this year has been a busy time. I thank all EPNS representatives for their hard work and dedication.

Young EPNS (YEPNS)

With pleasure, I can announce that this committee is now aligned with the YEPNS Climate change & Environmental Awareness Working Group, with their primary aim to bring sustainability and the climate issue to Society's priorities. More details are shared in the YEPNS update in this annual report.

European Medicines Agency (EMA)

The EMA fosters interaction with healthcare professionals, including doctors, pharmacists and nurses who are independent experts in clinical practice, to incorporate the real-world experience of the full spectrum of healthcare into drug



development, benefit/risk evaluation and monitoring.

This year the EPNS became an EMA stakeholder to ensure Child Neurology is represented in the evaluation and supervision of medicines.

We will be nominating experts in key paediatric neurology fields to be EMA points of contact.

European Brain Council (EBC)

The EPNS has been a full member of the EBC since 2021. The EBC is non-profit network of key players in the "Brain Area" which consists of Scientific societies, patient organisations, professional societies, and industry partners.

Sameer Zuberi is the EPNS legal representative.

The EBC is a powerful supporter for prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of brain diseases and research of the brain as a priority for Society. Through this network, the EPNS is advocating at an EU level for the life-course approach to brain health from antenatal influences on brain development, through to childhood, adolescence and onto later life.





The EBC organised a Brain Awareness week starting on 16 March 2023 which I attended and reflected on the importance of focusing on brain capital and our future generations.



We were pleased to welcome the EBC to the recent EPNS Congress in Prague, where they had an exhibition desk, and the EPNS have been involved in many of the EBC activities including the animal research project, Rethinking projects, Value of Treatment discussions and the EBC strategic workshop in September 2023.

The EBC organised the Brain Innovation Days (BIDs) which took place on 26-27 October 2023 and centred around building resilience and better brain health for future generations and increasing our brains' readiness to adapt to an ever-changing environment. Sameer Zuberi was a member of the Steering Committee for the BIDs programme, and we were delighted that he was able to chair a session entitled 'In Discussion With: Innovative Gene-Related Therapies' session with insights from amongst others, EPNS Board member, Francesco Muntoni. Also,

during the event, the Young EPNS (YEPNS) presented a Poster '*Climate change and Environmental awareness: a European working group to study the environmental impact and promote sustainability in Child Neurology*'. Tessa Wassenberg and Maria Gogou represented the YEPNS at the event.

Coordination and Support Action (CSA) Brain Health

The European Commission is launching a European Partnership on Brain Health in 2025/2026 to further coordinate and structure the area of brain health research in Europe. To prepare for this, the CSA has been kicked off, with the EBC involved as one of the several partners. The EPNS looks forward to contributing to this group in developing a European Brain Health landscape, identifying priorities, advocating for brain health, and creating a collaborative framework by speaking with one voice.

78th United Nations General Assembly

The EBC invited Kevin Rostasy, EPNS President, to attend the Brain Health & Research Day on 18 September 2023 in New York. This was an excellent opportunity where policymakers, researchers, clinicians, industry leaders, patient representatives & non-profits met from all over the world with the purpose of putting Brain Health higher up on the UN agenda.





European Academy of Neurology (EAN)



The EAN is a Society focusing on Adult Neurology in Europe, working closely with the EPNS. The two societies have a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate in education & research. The EPNS is pleased to have representatives on

nineteen EAN scientific panels, which have a significance for child neurology. The Presidents of the 2 societies meet regularly with other board representatives and the collaboration is developing stronger with an emphasis on especially working together in the field of brain health, guidelines and the process of transition. Building on this collaboration, a joint EPNS/EAN webinar on headache treatment is planned in 2024 and the EPNS looks forward to being part of the next EAN Congress in Helsinki, 2024. You will read in Dana Craiu's Guideline Committee update in this report about the recently formed EPNS/EAN Taskforce on Transition which is an important step in this area.

Brain Health Mission



This year the EPNS joined the Brain Health Mission (BHM) as a strategic partner. The BHM is an inclusive advocacy initiative, to get various stakeholders on board to create general awareness for the importance of Brain Health – from doctors to caregivers as well as patients, governments, industry etc.

I attended the first Brain Health Summit on 16 November 2023 in Brussels.

Scope



The Committee is formed of eminent professors, members of the EPNS Board and numerous invited specialists, non-board members (for specific tasks), CNA and the YEPNS members of the Guidelines Group. There is an important collaboration with the A&C committee facilitating

cooperation with the ERNs and different professional societies (EAN, ILAE) or narrow specialized professional groups serving in the area of neurological disorders, based on MoUs (Memorandum of Understanding) for guidelines production.

The EPNS President and the EPNS Scientific Committee approve the Guidelines Committee activities.




Young EPNS (YEPNS)

Prioritisation

Following the distribution of the questionnaire created by the GC of the EPNS and YEPNS, Marietta Papadopoulou, the current YEPNS president identified the topics for which practice protocols and guidelines are necessary with priority.





EpiCARE – ILAE-EAN-EPNS guidelines

EPNS is currently a partner in the process of guidelines production initiated by EpiCARE in association with other 2 professional societies (EAN, ILAE): Infantile spasms, Dravet Syndrome, Lennox-Gastaut Syndrome. EPNS will also participate in the Epilepsy surgery and Status epilepticus Guidelines. The Guidelines will be published in the EJPN.



The restless Legs Syndrome guideline

EPNS is a partner of the EAN in production of the European Guidelines on the Management of Restless Legs Syndrome in cooperation with EURLSSG, MDS, EPNS & ESRS. EPNS is represented by Professor Oliviero Bruni in this working group.

EPNS and Dystonia project

The Italian group headed by Franca Benini launched the Dystonia in Paediatric Palliative care. Jean Pierre Lin represents EPNS as a partner in scoping Delphi project in Dystonia in children.



Adoption of the ILAE neonatal seizures treatment protocol

Kathleen Gorman and a group of non-EPNS Board members applied the Adoption protocol for rare disorders as a standard protocol of endorsement of the ILAE neonatal seizures treatment protocol. The process is going to be finalized January 2024 and the protocol displayed on the EPNS website.

Project on Transition in Europe

I am delighted to report that in collaboration with the European Academy of Neurology (EAN), a new Task Force has been formed with 4 members of the EPNS Board and 4 members of the EAN. The first meeting will take place in January 2024, and I look forward to progressing further.

DMD Delphi initiative

This group, headed by Rosaline Quinlivan, Diana Castro, and Thomas Sejersen regarding the development of a new global Delphi initiative aiming to establish consensus among global experts in DMD on best practice for transitioning patients from paediatric to adult healthcare services will make a written partnership with EPNS, as co-author of the final document; Thomas Sejersen will represent EPNS; the final document will be published in the EJPN.

Website

A subgroup of the GC discussed and decided the pathway of guidelines production and responsible persons for decision making. The information will be soon displayed on the EPNS website.

I am looking forward to keeping EPNS members informed about this important work. We are currently working to identify guidelines with paediatric neurology overlap and are interested in being an active partner in the ERNs guidelines development groups for the guidelines with neurological involvement.

YEPNS has kept the same structure renaming some of the Working Groups in order to better reflect the current activities with the addition of a new working group on Climate Change and Sustainability, a topic that is of high priority in the Agenda of YEPNS and EPNS. Here is a summary of the main activities of each working group for the past year! Each working group Coordinator has recently been linked to and will be working together with the Chair of the relevant EPNS Committee to facilitate the participation of YEPNS in the conception and development of common projects!

The Research & Career working group (WG) was coordinated by Jelte Helfferich. Their primary project - Journal Club webinars successfully presented every other month, planned together with EPNS's Science & Research Committee. The Research and Career WG is also implicated in the development of the EPNS's Exam and Curriculum working group, coordinated by EPNS's Education & Training Committee and in other research activities, as the next EPNS Research Meeting 2024 that will be held in Ljubljana. YEPNS Podcast, initially resuming the content of the Journal Clubs and eventually on different topics too, is the next big project that will be held by this working group. Additionally, ideas on projects to support potential YEPNS/EPNS collaborative research projects are in discussion.

The Education & Clinic working group was coordinated by Karina Kersbergen. Webinars in form of "Case Discussions" were prepared, organized, and presented by this working group every other month. Initial discussions have also be launched in collaboration with the EPNS Education and Training Committee regarding an EPNS mentor-mentee project.

<mark>YOUNG</mark> EUROPEAN PAEDIATRIC



The Social Media & Networking working group was coordinated by Roberto Previtali. Members of this working group were in charge of managing YEPNS's Facebook account (YEPNS), Instagram account (young_EPNS) and email account (<u>yepns@epns.info</u>) with constantly increasing followers in both accounts. There are regular weekly posts advertising all EPNS/YEPNS activities, when possible in an interactive way (i.e. quizzes regarding the topic of Journal Clubs or Case discussions). Marietta and Ainara Salazar have represented YEPNS in the International collaboration of Young Representatives of World's Paediatric Neurology Societies meetings every three months. Further meetings with young representatives of other neurological societies (ILAE, EAN, Ithaca) took place with plan to formalize mutual collaboration in the future and a common YEPNS/YES session is discussed for the next European Epilepsy Congress.

The Guidelines & Good Clinical Practice working group was coordinated by Lena Luise Becker. Several members of this WG were actively involved with EPNS transition guidelines project last year and discussions on how to further evolve this project are ongoing. Several YEPNS members were invited to participate in the ongoing guidelines projects of ILAE/EpiCARE/EAN and recently EPNS joint guidelines. There was also participation in the Appraisal of existing guidelines in order for them to be endorsed by EPNS. An educational file repository along training activities regarding the process of guidelines formation.

The Climate change and Sustainability working group was created and coordinated by Thomas Foiadelli. The aim of this group is to raise awareness regarding the impact of climate change in pediatric neurology and to reduce the environmental footprint of YEPNS/EPNS promoting positive actions and collaborations. The members of the working group have already met with Intercongress, the EPNS president and a representative of the organizing committee of the next EPNS Congress in order to discuss ideas for a "green" Congress. The EPNS Advocacy Committee has supported the participation of this working group in the Brain Innovation Days meeting where Tessa Wassenberg has presented a poster on the topic.

Last but not least, **our favorite YEPNS time of the year was the 15th EPNS Congress in Prague**. Many YEPNS members have participated in the Congress and submitted their original work for presentation, while also supporting the organization by reviewing submitted abstracts and successfully chairing several poster and parallel sessions. A YEPNS Committee meeting was formally held during the Congress along with many informal discussions and meetings during coffee breaks. The YEPNS "Guess the syndrome" session was presented and coordinated by Thomas, Karina and Marietta with the kind mentoring of Drs Lim and Lin. A very successfully sold-out YEPNS night took place during the congress thanks to the support of the EPNS and Pavel Krsek and the local organizing Committee.





YEPNS Committee has worked intensively in 2023 to promote YEPNS on a national and international level and to continue all the ongoing YEPNS projects! Committee National Advisers (C N A)

The Committee of National Advisers is constituted of advisers selected by the national paediatric neurology societies and associations from European countries according to the World Health Organization (WHO) European Region definition. Normally each country is represented by one member. Currently 44 countries are represented in the CNA along with an observer from the European Academy of Neurology (EAN).

The CNA is a forum for mutual information, discussion and debate on matters relevant to pediatric neurology. The CNA has an executive group consisting of its chairperson, secretary and 3

elected members. The CNA is independent of the EPNS but is intended to work in close relation with it. While the CNA is constituted of advisers selected by the national societies, the EPNS is a society of individual members. The CNA is represented on the board of the EPNS and in its Education and Training committee by its chairperson and elected members. The EPNS is represented in the CNA by its president and other relevant persons as full members of the CNA.

Established in 2022, the EPNS Advocacy and Collaboration Committee will be bringing up new opportunities to improve this relation further.

C N A Meeting

The CNA meets biennially just before the EPNS Congress. The CNA meeting took place on 20 June 2023, before the 15th EPNS Meeting in Prague, Czech Republic, 20-24 June 2023. It has been a marvellous opportunity for the CNA members to meet finally face to face after online and hybrid meetings due to the pandemic situation during previous years.

Following the hybrid CNA meeting in Glasgow in 2022, this years' meeting brought together 30 representatives. It was a wonderful opportunity for the representatives to gather and hear a comprehensive update about the EPNS activities, as well as bring up comments and questions on relavent topics. Following introduction of the participants, Dilek Yalnizoglu, the CNA Chair, presented an introduction on the role of CNA as well as summary of action points from the meeting in 2022. Kevin Rostasy, the EPNS President, emphasized the importance of CNA for the the EPNS in reaching out to the national societies. Thorough updates on EPNS activities were presented by Dana Craiu, the chair of Education & Training Committee and Guidelines Committee, Barbara Plecko, the chair of Scientific & Research Committee, Anna Jansen, the chair of Advocacy and Collaboration Committee, and Jean-Pierre Lin, the chair of Membership, PR & Website Committee. This years' CNA meeting highlight was the first EPNS Exam held on the same day and at the same floor with the CNA meeting. Maja Steinlin, head of the EPNS Exam Organizing Team, gave a detailed presentation covering the references for the exam, including the EPNS syllabus, training guide with webinar/course synchronisation, and provided information on types of questions and replied all comments and questions regarding the exam by the participants. Subsequently, CNA members were invited to include their local network -if they thought



that would be more productive- and continue to support the upcoming EPNS Exams, by the EPNS Exam Organising Team and the CNA chair.

At the end of the meeting time was reserved for CNA members who wished to present their projects and comments on different topics. Ralitza Yordanova from Bulgaria made a presentation on behalf of Ivan Ivanov and colleagues, 'Survey on mass developmental screening', and invited CNA members to participate. On behalf Vesna Brankovic-Sreckovic from Serbia, Dilek Yalnizoglu mentioned the importance of subspeciality training in Europe under paediatric neurology such as epilepsy and neurophysiology, neuromuscular diseases, and such.

CNA Executive Committee

The CNA election takes place every 4 years to appoint the Executive Committee positions: Chair, Secretary and 2 Members for 4 years, and each person can serve 2 times in a particular role. The current CNA Executive Committee for the 2022-2026 term consists of 4 positions:

Training Advisory Board (TAB)

In 2002 Paediatric neurology was accepted at the European level as a sub-specialty of Paediatrics and of Neurology. In the process of defining the specialty, a European Paediatric Neurology Training Programme (Syllabus) was compiled and accepted by the European Paediatric Neurology Society (EPNS) and the national societies represented in the Committee of National Advisors (CNA) in Paediatric Neurology as well as the European Union of Medical Specialists (UEMS) sections for Paediatrics and Neurology. The revised Syllabus was again discussed and accepted with entry both from Paediatrics or Neurology by EAP (European Academy of Paediatrics, the Paediatric Division of UEMS) in December 2010. The Syllabus was revised and updated

by a CNA working group in 2019, which was accepted by the General Board of EPNS and by the CNA (https://www.epns.info/education-and-training/european-syllabus/).

In order to push the implementation of a high standard of paediatric neurology training, in 2004 the EPNS Board and the CNA agreed to create a Training Advisory Board (TAB) and to develop a training evaluation programme intended to support national societies in developing their training systems. TAB offers the national child neurology societies the opportunity to evaluate their national training system. The aim is a standard of training in accordance with the European Paediatric Neurology Training Programme (Syllabus) in each European country. The assessment is voluntary and initiated by the national paediatric neurology society. So far the training system was evaluated in 13 countries.

The most recent TAB visit was to Ukraine completed by Dana Craiu (Bucharest, Romania) and Coriene Catsman (Rotterdam, the Netherlands) in 2021. The report of this visit was presented at the EPNS board meeting and at the CNA meeting in 2022, then the approved report was published on the EPNS website (<u>https://www.epns.info/about-epns/tab/</u>).

I look forward to working with national paediatric neurology societies while EPNS/TAB continues to support and develop national training programmes. Also, I suggest that national societies of the countries who had been visited in the past may consider if they will benefit from an update visit and re-evaluate their progress and accomplishments over time.

The European Journal of Paediatric Neurology (EJPN) is the official journal of the EPNS and is available to all members in either electronic or print & electronic format. Published 6 times a year by Elsevier Ltd. on behalf of the society it accepts highquality papers primarily of a clinical research nature on the whole spectrum of paediatric neurological disease, as well as consensus statements and expert guidelines on current. The journal is owned by the society and contributes to the income of the EPNS through royalty payments.

With an Impact Factor of 3.1, the number and quality of submissions remains high, despite the difficulties posed by the pandemic. Three new special issues on current interesting

topics are on the way, with many world-leading basic and clinical neuroscientists contributing articles.

In accordance with the educational nature of EPNS, the Editorial team has already started to publish high-quality "Teaching Papers" on specific topics presented in the EPNS monthly Webinars.

Additionally, the Editorial Team together with the EPNS Board awarded for the first time the "EJPN Paper of the Year" award (original paper), which was presented during the Opening Ceremony of the Biennial EPNS Congress in Prague (June 2023) and which is accompanied by a money prize of 1000 Euros and free registration to the Congress and will be awarded every two years during the Opening Ceremony of each future EPNS Congress.

The journal has a distinguished and recently renewed international Editorial Board of specialists who advise on the direction of the journal, special issues, and review papers, superbly moderated by the five Associated Editors, Deborah Sival, Lucia Gerstl, Alexis Arzimanoglou, Anne Jansen and Ming Lim and who are world-renowned experts in their field.

A little more information about

The European Paediatric Neurology Society (EPNS)

A society for physicians with a research or clinical interest in Paediatric Neurology. Honorary membership is for persons who the society wishes to honour for outstanding distinction in the field of paediatric neurology.

Associate membership is awarded, on application, to all paediatric neurologists and colleagues in related fields and that belong to their national society or association in their field and to any physician, basic scientist or clinical scientist trainees in paediatric neurology who shows an interest in the neurology of infancy, childhood, or adolescence, whether in research or in clinical medical care. There are no geographical restrictions to associate membership. Associate members pay an annual subscription, which includes subscription to the European Journal of Paediatric Neurology, the Journal of the Society. **Ordinary membership** is for any associate member that is also in practice in Europe (currently taken as the region for which European Office of WHO is responsible). Transition from associate to ordinary membership takes place by the vote of the general assembly at the meeting of The Society. The only difference between associate and ordinary membership is the entitlement of ordinary members to vote for and stand as candidates for election to the Board of the Society.

EPNS Membership Fees for 2024

EPNS membership fees (also known as subscription fees) are payable each year and cover the period 1 January until 31 December.

Each fully paid up member of the EPNS receives access to the <u>EJPN</u> as part of their membership (printed and online ,or online only access, depending on the fee paid). The EPNS Membership Fee paid for the year 2024 depends on several factors:

1. Your EPNS Membership Category

For physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology, the EPNS Membership categories are based on the World Bank (WB) income category of the country in which you practice.

Here is the list of World Bank Classification 4 high income nations <u>World Bank list of high</u> income economies 2024

- WB4A= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in Class 4 high income nations on this list NOT highlighted in blue
- **WB4B**= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in Class 4 high income nations on this list HIGHLIGHTED in blue
- **WB123**= Physicians/medical doctors who specialise in Paediatric Neurology or another medical field with an interest in Paediatric Neurology who practice in countries NOT in Class 4 high income nations, i.e., countries NOT on list this.
- **GNP** = Mutual members of the Gesellschaft für Neuropädiatrie (GNP) and the EPNS



The EPNS also has the following categories for colleagues who have an interest in paediatric neurology. These categories are not based on the World Bank classification, they are the same for all nations:

- **Trainee/Resident**= qualified physicians/medical doctors who are in training to in Paediatric Neurology or another field in medicine and have an interest in Paediatric Neurology
- **AHPN** = Allied Health professionals and Nurses with an interest in Paediatric Neurology, e.g., Specialist Nurse Practitioners, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language therapists, Psychologists/Neuropsychologists, Dieticians, Radiographers, etc.
- NSCS = Neuroscientists and other Clinical Specialists with an interest in Paediatric Neurology including PhD students. This is a broad group ranging from bench scientists to specialized technically trained individuals encompassing: Neurogenetics, Neurochemistry, Neurophysiology, neurodevelopmental biology, Neuroepidemiology, health economists, data modelling (machine learning) specialists, etc.
- **PhD** = full time PhD Student
- Med Stud= Medical undergraduate students with an interest in Paediatric Neurology

2. Online only Journal access or printed Journal too

Each fully paid-up member of the EPNS automatically receives access to the <u>Society</u> <u>Journal</u> as part of their membership. EPNS members can opt to pay a Membership fee with online access to the Journal or they can pay more and also receive a printed copy of the Journal which will be posted to their nominated mailing address.
