16th EPNS Congress 2025

The 16th EPNS Congress will take place at the ICM – International Congress Center Munich, Germany on 8-12 July 2025, hosted by the Gesellschaft für Neuropädiatrie (GNP). Professor Florian Heinen is our Congress Chair and EPNS Board member, Dr Lucia Gerstl is the Congress Secretary

The Congress will classify our field into 'A for acute, B for Brain, Health & Science and C for Chronic', building our own alphabet of caring and research dedicated to children.

The programme has been developed with innovative platform sessions and approx. 80 distinguished invited speakers. With 922 abstracts submitted, 140 of which have been accepted as oral abstracts, 105 moderated posters with short presentations and 662 eposters to be shown at Terminals through the event, the congress is already promising to be an excellent meeting. With pleasure together the GNP and the EPNS has awarded 40 bursaries.

I thank the Local Organising Committee (LOC), all my colleagues on the EPNS Board and the YEPNS for their hard work in planning the event and developing a stimulating scientific programme.

5th Aicardi Award Lecture I will be honoured to be presented with this award during the opening ceremony on 8 July 2025. My lecture will be entitled 'Biomarker Research in Neurometabolic Disorders'.

EPNS Best Paper this prestigious prize will also be presented at the Opening Ceremony. **EPNS Congress Awards** In addition to the above, there will be a further 3 prizes awarded during the event: Outstanding Abstract, Best Oral Presentation and Best Poster Presentation.

EPNS Academy and EPNS Highlights are two sessions which take place on the last day of the EPNS congress which complement the main programme, and we are delighted to have the honour of many distinguished speakers.

Pre-Congress Symposium will take place on 8 July 2025 'The Child and the Brain. Where it's all started. One day of interactive future' and hosted by the GNP offering an exclusive deep dive into paediatric neurology's past, present, and future. Held at the state-of-the-art BrainLab in Munich, this interactive event combines clinical examination, neuroimaging, neuromodulation, AI, gene therapy, and philosophy in an engaging format.



EPNS Exam

The CNA have contributed to the exam question development. The EPNS Exam assesses the basic knowledge needed to underpin Paediatric Neurology training. Achieving a pass in the EPNS Exam is an excellent personal goal in this area of specialised medicine. Candidates wanting to test their knowledge, including those in countries without a nationally recognised exit exam, will find it very helpful.


EPNS Membership, PR, and Website Report

This committee continues with its goal to advocate at the highest level for the life-course approach to brain health from antenatal influences on brain development, through to childhood, adolescence and transition to later life.



Intersectoral Global Action Plan on epilepsy and other neurological disorders (IGAP)

The World Health Organisation's (WHO) IGAP is our focus. In May 2022, all Member States adopted the IGAP 2022-2031, which aims to improve access to treatment and care and quality of life of people with neurological disorders, their carers and families as well as promote brain health across the life-course. It includes actions to be undertaken by all stakeholders to attain the global targets.

OneNeurology



The EPNS is a partner of OneNeurology which is an initiative

aiming to unite and strengthen neurology-related groups to stimulate collaborative

advocacy, action and accountability for the prevention, treatment, and management of neurological disorders worldwide. OneNeurology is focusing on implementation IGAP through the member states. Coriene Catsman-Berrevoets, EPNS Honorary Member, is vice Chair of OneNeurology and represents the EPNS at meetings, such



as the World Health Assembly in Geneva May 2025 and contributing an EPNS statement to the WHA Item 13.1: 'Follow-up to the political declaration of the third high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases'.



European Brain Council (EBC)



The EPNS has been a full member of the EBC since 2021. Congratulations to Sameer Zuberi, EPNS Board member and past EPNS President, who has been elected as Vice-President of the EBC. This is a great opportunity to ensure the voice of

child neurology is heard in this European network of key players in the 'brain area'.

The EBC is a powerful supporter for prevention, early diagnosis and treatment of brain diseases and research of the brain as a priority for Society. Through this network, the EPNS is advocating at an EU level for the life-course approach to brain health from antenatal influences on brain development, through to childhood, adolescence and onto later life.

Sameer Zuberi represented the EPNS at the EBC "Rare Disease Day 2025: Towards a Rare Brain Disease Ecosystem" event on 20 February 2025



The EBC invited the EPNS to participate on 5 March 2025 at an event entitled "Health & Social Benefits from Reduced Alcohol Consumption: When Less is More" which was hosted by MEP Jonas Sjöstedt to discuss policies to reduce alcohol harms. After the presentation of key findings, there was a panel discussion with the EPNS kindly represented by panellist Mirjam Landgraf. There was a fruitful discussion about the impact of alcohol on brain health.

Kevin Rostasy represented the EPNS at an EBC organised Stakeholder Event 'International Workshop National Brain Plans' in Bern, 13 June 2025.

Recently the EPNS endorsed the European Charter for the Responsible Development of Neurotechnologies which Sameer Zuberi contributed to.

Many more projects are developing for the EPNS in collaboration with the EPNS including the Brain Innovation Days in Brussels on 14-16 October 2025, and a further update will be provided in the full annual report for 2025.

European Academy of Neurology (EAN)



The EAN is a Society focusing on Adult Neurology in Europe, working closely with the EPNS. The two societies have a Memorandum of Understanding to collaborate in guidelines, education & research. The EPNS is pleased to have

representatives on nineteen EAN scientific panels, which have a significance for child



neurology. The Presidents of the 2 societies meet regularly with other board representatives to work together in the field of brain health, guidelines and the process of transition. At EPNS Congress 2025, there will be a joint EPNS/EAN parallel session entitled 'Dyskinetic cerebral palsy: Update in management opportunities' with invited speaker Anne Koy. The 2025 EAN Congress will take place in Helsinki in June and the EPNS is pleased to have the session 'Acute demyelinating syndromes across the ages' labelled as a joint session, with speakers Kevin Rostasy, Barbara Kornek and Rinze Neuteboom.

The EPNS hosted an EPNS/EAN Joint educational webinar on 14 May 2025 discussing

Endorsement process

The EPNS uses AGREE II, an instrument used by other esteemed organisations, to consistently endorse existing guidelines. Details will be uploaded here as the EPNS begins to take this forward https://www.epns.info/epns-guideline-development-rules/ There are already several papers which are in the pipeline to undergo the EPNS endorsement process, and more details will be provided in the full year EPNS annual report for 2025.

Project on Transition in Europe

The EPNS is collaborating with the EAN which has an active Taskforce looking at transition from childhood to adulthood in Europe. Thank you to everyone who completed the recent fact-finding survey; analysis has started so the Taskforce can address the areas highlighted. A position paper is being created for all adult neurologists and child neurologists to increase awareness across all neurological conditions. This will be a common general framework on the principles of transition.

ILAE neonatal seizures treatment protocol

This guideline has been awarded EPNS endorsement using AGREEII and can be found on the EPNS Guidelines HUB.



Dystonia in Paediatric Palliative care

A collaborative project has been completed by the Paediatric Dystonia and Palliative Care Group and EPNS, represented by Jean-Pierre Lin. The guideline is now available on the EPNS Guidelines HUB.

EPNS IGAP Initiative

In 2021, WHO published a discussion paper; Intersectoral Global Action Plan (IGAP) on Epilepsy and Other Neurological Disorders 2022-2031. Following a period of consultations and revisions, IGAP was adopted unanimously at World Health Assembly in 2022.

In 2024, the EPNS started an initiative regarding IGAP. The EPNS vision is to ensure IGAP is implemented in each European country with the voice of child neurology heard. This has been an ongoing project lead by Kevin Rostasy, EPNS President and Anna Jansen, Chair EPNS Advocacy and Collaboration Committee, in collaboration with WHO.

Initially a survey on IGAP was sent to CNA members in January 2024, after data gathering and evaluation, an EPNS IGAP zoom meeting was held in 14 March 2024. The panel included Kevin Rostasy, EPNS President, Vanessa Cavallera, Technical Officer, WHO, Anna Jansen, Chair EPNS Advocacy and Collaboration Committee, Dilek Yalnizoglu, Chair CNA Executive Committee. One EPNS IGAP representative from almost

Training Advisory Board (TAB)

In 2002 Paediatric Neurology was accepted at the European level as a sub-specialty of Paediatrics and of Neurology. In the process of defining the specialty, a European Paediatric Neurology Training Programme (Syllabus) was compiled and accepted by the European Paediatric Neurology Society (EPNS) and the national societies represented in the Committee of National Advisors (CNA) in Paediatric Neurology as well as the European Union of Medical Specialists (UEMS) sections for Paediatrics and Neurology. The revised Syllabus was

again discussed and accepted with entry both from Paediatrics or Neurology by EAP (European Academy of Paediatrics, the Paediatric Division of UEMS) in December 2010. The Syllabus was revised and updated by a CNA working group in 2019, which was accepted by the General Board of EPNS and by the CNA (https://www.epns.info/education-and-training/european-syllabus/).

In order to push the implementation of a high standard of paediatric neurology training, in 2004 the EPNS Board and the CNA agreed to create a Training Advisory Board (TAB) and to develop a training evaluation programme intended to support national societies in developing their training systems. TAB offers the national child neurology societies the opportunity to evaluate their national training system. The aim is a standard of training in accordance with the European Paediatric Neurology Training Programme (Syllabus) in each European country. The assessment is voluntary and initiated by the national paediatric neurology society. So far the training system was evaluated in 13 countries. The most recent TAB visit was to Ukraine completed in 2021.

I am delighted to announce that CNA-TAB has received an invitation from Spanish Paediatric Neurology Society, SENEP in October 2024. Thanks to SENEP for the invitation, and a TAB visit to Spain is currently in preparation.

I look forward to working with national paediatric neurology societies while EPNS TAB continues to support national training programmes. In addition, I suggest that national societies of the countries who had been visited in the past may consider if they will benefit from an update visit and asses their progress and accomplishments after the first evaluation. In the mean time, reminder letters to CNA members will be sent periodically.

The European Paediatric Neurology Society (EPNS)

Honorary membership is for persons who the society wishes to honour for outstanding distinction in the field of paediatric neurology.

Associate membership is awarded, on application, to all paediatric neurologists and colleagues in related fields and that belong to their national society or association in their field and to any physician, basic scientist or clinical scientist trainees in paediatric neurology who shows an interest in the neurology of infancy, childhood, or adolescence, whether in research or in clinical medical care. There are no geographical restrictions to associate membership. Associate members pay an annual subscription, which includes subscription to the European Journal of Paediatric Neurology, the Journal of the Society. Ordinary membership is for any associate member that is also in practice in Europe (currently taken as the region for which European Office of WHO is responsible). Transition from associate to ordinary membership takes place by the vote of the general assembly at the meeting of The Society. The only difference between associate and ordinary membership is the entitlement of ordinary members to vote for and stand as candidates for election to the Board of the Society.

EPNS Membership Fees for 2025 and 2026

EPNS membership fees (also known as subscription fees) are payable each year and cover the period 1 January until 31 December.

EPNS members who have paid the current year EPNS membership fee receives access to the EPNS Moodle, ONLINE European Journal of Paediatric Neurology (EJPN), participate in EPNS activities, discounted EPNS Congress registration fees, plus much more. EPNS members may also pay an extra fee to receive a printed copy of the FOR ONE YEAR European Journal of Paediatric Neurology (EJPN)
